MS research at an impasse

Every year at various events like the "Risotto Day", the "Joggathlon", as well as at benefit concerts, money is collected in Switzerland for MS research. A large portion of this money is invested in animal experimentation projects.

Result: In spite of intensive animal experimentation, which has been supported with massive funds over the last several decades, and despite numerous announcements of success by the animal experimenters, the cause of MS remains unknown and a cure is not in sight.

Due to fundamental differences between species and their metabolisms, animal experiments do not permit any valid, reliable conclusions about humans. Furthermore, an artificially and forcibly induced «disease» in an animal is not comparable to the naturally and spontaneously occurring MS in a human being. In fact, the fixation on invalid, unreliable animal experiments guarantees that MS remains incurable.

We need a new generation of researchers who renounce animal experiments and who focus on a truly human-based medicine. In order to achieve real progress in alleviating, curing and preventing human diseases, researchers must concentrate on valid, reliable methods which are of direct relevance to people.
